

The Theory of Light and Matter: Stories

by Andrew Porter

Debut collection of Carver-esque stories of memory and sacrifice.

Andrew Porter's stunning meditations on loss and remembrance form his first short story collection, *The Theory of Light and Matter*. Porter crafts stories of disparate lives—a brother wonders if he can forgive his sister; a woman chooses between an older professor and her intended husband; a man ruminates on the death of a childhood friend—in an evocative, straightforward prose style reminiscent of Raymond Carver. His stories explore the nature of guilt and sacrifice and the eccentricity and unpredictability of memory and forgiveness. *The Theory of Light and Matter* won a Flannery O'Connor Award upon publication; Time Out New York <u>called it</u> "exquisite," saying it "delivers... constant delight."
